RANEE LEE RAISES HER VOICE AGAINST RACIAL DISCRIMINATION

Ranee Lee, C.M., became a Member of the Order of Canada in 2005. On March 21, 2007, the celebrated jazz singer took part in the Governor General's Students' Forum: From the Abolition of the Slave Trade to the Elimination of Racial Discrimination, at Rideau Hall. The forum commemorated the Abolition of the Slave Trade Act, passed in British Parliament in 1807. (Canada was still a collection of British colonies at that time.) The forum's purpose was also to raise awareness of the importance of eliminating racism and promoting human rights in Canadian society today. Mrs. Lee participated in the discussion and gave a moving performance of "Strange Fruit," a Billie Holiday song about the lynching of Blacks in the American South. "It's a very powerful tune," says Mrs. Lee, who has recorded the song, but hasn't performed it often. She says that performing the song at the forum was important to her because it could raise awareness of racial discrimination. "Any time I can lend my voice for this cause, I'm 110% for it."

On June 7, 2007, the Governor General will participate in the official opening of the exhibit "The Order of Canada: They Desire a Better Country." The exhibit will be held at Library and Archives Canada in Ottawa to mark the 40th anniversary of the Order and will be open to the public for approximately one year.

An accomplished graphic artist, Bruce Beatty, C.M., is the creative force behind most of the symbolic representations that make up our Canadian System of Honours, beginning with the beautiful snowflake design of the Order of Canada. As of February 2007, Mr. Beatty has assisted the Chancellery with 98 Order of Canada ceremonies, attending all but one since the creation of the Order. Mr. Beatty became a Member of the Order in 1990.

- Since the creation of the Canadian System of Honours, 5,268 people have been invested into the Order of Canada.
- There are currently 3,100 living members of the Order of Canada.
- Every year, a maximum of 136 Members are appointed to the Order, along with 64 Officers. The total number of Companions is limited at any time to 165.
